Congestion in West Park on Sunday 23-01-2022

This is to warn residents to expect traffic and parking disruption in West Park this coming Sunday. There will be a large cross country event on the West Park fields. Starting from 10.00 am it will include a range of events with several hundred competitors.

Details with maps of the routes can be viewed on the <u>website for the Peco XC</u> <u>league</u>, which is the organisation responsible for planning the meeting. The events will bring a lot of traffic into West Park and inevitably the prospect of parking chaos.

So be prepared for some disruption...

From the website: "Car Parking: There is no designated car parking. There is good on-street parking available in the surrounding streets. Either around the housing estate near the tent area/senior finish or around the top of Butcher Hill. Do not park on Spen Lane as this is a busy, narrow road and is on a bus route and particularly do not park on the verge alongside Spen Lane. You can also park on the roads around West Park (LS16 5QR puts you in the vicinity)."

The website also warns people to: "Please park with respect to the locals who live there as they may need access whilst you are running. Do not park to obstruct driveways and consider that drivers may need space to swing in or out of driveways."
